Executive Summary Hate Crime in California 2024

Hate Crime in California 2024 presents statistics on hate crimes reported by California law enforcement agencies that occurred during 2024, with prior years also included for context. These statistics include the reported number of hate crime events¹, hate crime offenses², victims of hate crimes, and suspects of hate crimes. This report also provides statistics reported by district and elected city attorneys on the number of hate crime cases referred to prosecutors, the number of cases filed in court, and the disposition of those cases. For the purposes of this report, a hate crime refers to a criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity. The total number of hate crime events, offenses, victims, and suspects increased in 2024.

The following statements highlight the major trends in Hate Crime in California for 2024*.

Crime Data

From 2015 to 2024, hate crime events have increased by 141.7% (Table 11).

Reported hate crime events increased 2.7% from 1,970 in 2023 to 2,023 in 2024 (Table 11).

Reported hate crime offenses increased 8.9% from 2,359 in 2023 to 2,568 in 2024 (Table 12).

The number of victims of reported hate crimes increased 8.2% from 2,303 in 2023 to 2,491 in 2024 (Table 15).

The number of suspects of reported hate crimes increased 7.3% from 1,844 in 2023 to 1,979 in 2024 (Table 15).

¹ The term *event* is defined as an occurrence where a hate crime is involved. (In this report, the information about the event is a crime report or source document that meets the criteria for a hate crime.) There may be one or more suspects involved, one or more victims targeted, and one or more offenses involved for each event.

² The term *offense* is defined as criminal acts that are recorded as follows: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, simple assault, intimidation, destruction/vandalism, and all other group A offenses as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting Program and in their national Hate Crimes Statistics Report.

^{*} Caution should be used when comparing 2024 crime data to prior years. Not all agencies were able to submit a full year of data for 2024. See Understanding the Data, Characteristics, and Known Limitations for additional information.

Reported hate crime events involving racial bias overall decreased 0.6% from 1,017 in 2023 to 1,011 in 2024 (Table 11).

- Anti-Black or African American bias events fell from 518 in 2023 to 494 in 2024, a decrease of 4.6%.
- Anti-Asian bias events fell from 125 in 2023 to 119 in 2024, a decrease of 4.8%.
- Anti-white bias events rose from 53 in 2023 to 61 in 2024, an increase of 15.1%.
- Anti-citizenship status bias events rose from 8 in 2023 to 16 in 2024.

Reported hate crime events involving a religion bias increased 3.0% from 394 in 2023 to 406 in 2024 (Table 11).

- Anti-Jewish bias events rose from 289 in 2023 to 310 in 2024, an increase of 7.3%.
- Anti-Islamic (Muslim) bias events fell from 40 in 2023 to 24 in 2024.
- Anti-Catholic bias events fell from 15 in 2023 to 9 in 2024.

Reported hate crime events involving a sexual orientation bias increased 12.3% from 405 in 2023 to 455 in 2024 (Table 11).

- Anti-gay (male) bias events rose from 231 in 2023 to 251 in 2024, an increase of 8.7%.
- Anti-LGBTQ+ bias events rose from 151 in 2023 to 172 in 2024, an increase of 13.9%.

Reported hate crime events involving a gender bias increased 2.4% from 82 in 2023 to 84 in 2024.

- Anti-transgender bias events rose from 65 in 2023 to 73 is 2024, an increase of 12.3%
- Anti-gender non-conforming bias events fell from 11 in 2023 to 7 in 2024.

Reported hate crime events involving a multiple-bias increased from 54 in 2023 to 59 in 2024, an increase of 9.3% (Table 11).

Reported hate crime offenses increased 8.9% from 2,359 in 2023 to 2,568 in 2024 (Table 13).

- Violent crime offenses increased 13.7% from 1,477 in 2023 to 1,679 in 2024 (Table 13).
- Property crime offenses increased 0.5% from 792 in 2023 to 796 in 2024 (Table 13).

Prosecutorial Data

Of the 818 hate crimes that were referred for prosecution in 2024, 506 cases were filed by district attorneys and elected city attorneys for prosecution. Of the 506 cases that were filed for prosecution, 327 were filed as hate crimes and 179 were filed as non-bias motivated crimes (Table 7A).

Of the 169 cases with a disposition available for this report:

- 40.8% (69) were hate crime convictions;
- 46.7% (79) were other convictions; and
- 12.4% (21) were not convicted (Table 7B).

Understanding the Data Characteristics and Known Limitations

Crime Data

Local law enforcement agencies are required to report hate crimes to the Department of Justice (DOJ) in compliance with California Penal Code section 13023. California Penal Code section 422.55 defines a hate crime as "a criminal act committed, in whole or in part, because of one or more of the following actual or perceived characteristics of the victim: (1) Disability, (2) Gender, (3) Nationality, (4) Race or ethnicity, (5) Religion, (6) Sexual orientation, (7) Association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics."

The following information and limitations should be considered when using hate crime data:

- 1) A hate crime event contains the occurrence of one or more criminal offenses, committed against one or more victims, by one or more suspects or perpetrators. Victims can have more than one offense committed against them.
- 2) Hate crimes reported by law enforcement agencies are counted in a specific way. In each hate crime event, DOJ counts the total number of victims, the total number of suspects, and the total number of criminal offenses in one event. These totals are then classified and counted by type of bias motivation (e.g., anti-Black or African American, anti-Hispanic or Latino, anti-Jewish, anti-gay, etc.), type of crime (e.g., murder, aggravated assault, burglary, destruction/ vandalism, etc.), the location where the crime took place (e.g., residence, street, synagogue, school, etc.), and the type of victim (e.g., individual, property, etc.).
- 3) DOJ requested that each law enforcement agency establish procedures incorporating a two-tier review (decision-making) process for identifying hate crimes. The first level is done by the initial officer who responds to the suspected hate crime incident. At the second level, each report is reviewed by at least one other officer to confirm that the event was, in fact, a hate crime.
- 4) Caution should be used when making jurisdictional comparisons. The following factors should be considered:
 - Demographic diversity and population density.
 - Size of law enforcement agencies.
 - The training received in the identification of hate crimes by law enforcement officers in each jurisdiction.
- 5) The following factors may influence the volume of hate crimes reported to DOJ:
 - Cultural practices of individuals and their likeliness to report hate crimes to law enforcement agencies.
 - Strength and investigative emphasis of law enforcement agencies.
 - Policies of law enforcement agencies.
 - Community policing policies.

6) In 2011, DOJ expanded the acceptable location codes for the California hate crime data collection system to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2013, DOJ expanded the gender bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include "gender non-conforming" to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2014, DOJ expanded the religion bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include "Sikh" in order to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2015, DOJ expanded the race and ethnicity bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include "Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander" in order to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2015, several religion bias types that were previously captured as Anti-other religion were separated out to reflect modifications implemented at the national level. The bias types are as follows: Anti-Buddhist, Anti-Church of Jesus Christ (formerly referenced as Mormon), Anti-Eastern Orthodox, Anti-Hindu, Anti-Jehovah's Witness, and Anti-other Christian.

In 2023, DOJ modified the label of the bias type "anti-homosexual" to "anti-LGBTQ+" to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2024, DOJ renamed the Anti-Mormon bias type to Anti-Church of Jesus Christ to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2024, DOJ marks the first time 10-year trends are available for the religion bias type change implemented in 2015. All religion bias types are now reflected in this annual report.

- 7) In 2013, the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program revised the definition of "forcible rape" (the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will) to "rape," which is now defined as "penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim." California DOJ implemented this definition change in January 2014.
- 8) In 2016, the FBI Director informed all state Statistical Analysis Centers that the FBI UCR program would be transitioning to a National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS)-only data collection by January 1, 2021. California DOJ embarked on a five-year effort to develop and implement a new state repository, the California Incident-Based Reporting System (CIBRS), to house the new FBI statistical reporting format. The CIBRS repository is a combination of the federal NIBRS requirements with additional California-specific data elements. California DOJ began collecting data in CIBRS in 2021.

Data represented in this publication are hybrid, a combination of both the summary incident and incident-based reporting (IBR) formats. Hate Crime data were already reported at the incident level prior to the implementation of IBR. The changes reflected in this year's publication as a result of the implementation of IBR impact the following areas: victim types and offenses. IBR expands the values associated with these two areas allowing for a more complete and descriptive picture of hate crime occurring in California.

9) Agency Limitations for 2024 - The following agencies did not report the full year of data due to a variety of reasons including but not limited to issues with their Record Management Systems (RMS), unresolved reporting errors, staffing issues, being newly established reporting agencies, or failing to submit data.

Imperial County

• Brawley Police Department (Unable to report January due to system issues.)

Kern County

- Arvin Police Department (Unable to report due to agency resource challenges.)
- Wasco Police Department (New agency beginning June 2024.)

Los Angeles County

• Downey Police Department (Unable to report due to system issues.)

Plumas County

• Plumas Sheriff's Department (Unable to report due to system issues.)

San Diego County

• San Diego Sheriff's Department (Transitioned to a new system and November and December counts are low.)

San Joaquin County

• Lodi Police Department (Due to RMS challenges, began reporting in August.)

Shasta County

• Redding Police Department (Unable to submit December due to agency challenges.)

County District Attorneys' and Elected City Attorneys' Prosecutorial Data

The following information and limitations should be considered when interpreting hate crime cases:

- 1) In order to show the criminal justice system's response to hate crimes, in 1995 the CA Attorney General asked all district attorneys and elected city attorneys to submit summary data of complaints filed and convictions secured.
- 2) The 2024 District Attorneys' and Elected City Attorneys' Report File of Hate Crime Cases contains summary data based on cases referred to each district attorney or elected city attorney, and filings and convictions that occurred from January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.
- 3) When viewing prosecutorial data, it is not possible to relate the number of hate crimes reported by law enforcement agencies to the number of hate crimes prosecuted by district attorneys and city attorneys. First, crimes often occur in different reporting years than their subsequent prosecutions. Second, the number of crimes reported by law enforcement is much higher than those calling for prosecutorial action since the latter requires an arrested defendant who can be prosecuted in a court of law.
- 4) The annual prosecutorial report collects data on the total number of hate crime cases filed and the total number of hate crime convictions as reported by each district attorney or elected city attorney. There is no direct relationship between "complaints filed" and "convictions," since a case may be filed in one year and the outcome (trial or pleading) may occur in another.
- 5) All prosecutorial data include hate crimes committed by both juvenile and adult defendants.

Appendix: Glossary

Aggravated Assault – An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purposes of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm (FBI's UCR definition).

Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or physical/mental disability.

Bisexual – Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward and responsiveness to both males and females; (noun) a bisexual person.

Case – A set of facts about a crime that is referred to a district attorney for filing with a court. The case may charge one or more persons with the commission of one or more offenses. (For this report, the case must contain some element of bias.)

Complaints Filed – Any verified written accusation, filed by a district attorney with a criminal court, that charges one or more persons with the commission of one or more offenses. (For this report, the case must contain some element of bias.)

Conviction – A judgment based on the verdict of a jury or a judicial officer or on a guilty plea or a nolo contendere plea of the defendant.

Disposition – In criminal procedure, the sentencing or other final settlement of a criminal case.

Ethnic Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same race or national origin who share common or similar traits in language, custom, and tradition.

Event – An occurrence when a hate crime is involved. (In this report, the information about the event is a crime report or source document that meets the criteria for a hate crime.) There may be one or more suspects involved, one or more victims targeted, and one or more offenses involved for each event.

Gay – Of or relating to males who experience a sexual attraction toward and responsiveness to other males; (noun) a homosexual male.

Gender Non-conforming – (adjective) Describes a person who does not conform to the gender-based expectations of society, e.g., a woman dressed in traditionally male clothing or a man wearing makeup.

Guilty Plea – A defendant's formal answer in open court stating that the charge is true and that he or she is guilty of the crime charged.

Hate Crime – A criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity.

Heterosexual – Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward and responsiveness to members of the opposite sex; (noun) a heterosexual person.

Known Suspect – Any person alleged to have committed a criminal act or attempted criminal act to cause physical injury, emotional suffering, or property damage. The known suspect category contains the number of suspects that have been identified and/or alleged to have committed hate crimes as stated in the crime report. For example, witnesses observe three suspects fleeing the scene of a crime. The word "known" does not necessarily refer to specific identities.

Lesbian – Of or relating to females who experience sexual attraction toward and responsiveness to other females; (noun) a homosexual female.

LGBTQ+ – Common initialism for "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer+," used here to refer to community organizations or events that serve lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and allied people.

Location – The place where the hate crime event occurred. The location categories follow UCR location specifications developed by the FBI. Examples are residence, hotel, bar, church, etc.

Multi-Racial – A hate crime that involves more than one victim or suspect, and where the victims or suspects are from two or more different race groups, such as African American and white or Hispanic and Asian.

Multiple-Bias Event – A hate crime event motivated by more than one type of bias.

Nolo Contendere – A plea or answer in a criminal action in which the accused does not admit guilt but agrees to be subject to the same punishment as if he or she were guilty.

Offenses – Criminal acts that are recorded as follows: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, simple assault, fondling, kidnapping/abduction, intimidation, destruction/vandalism, false pretense/swindle, hacking/computer invasion, weapons law violation, sodomy, sexual assault with an object, extortion/blackmail, impersonation, drug equipment violations, drug/narcotic violations, and pornography/obscene material as defined in the UCR and the national Hate Crimes Statistics Report.

Physical/Mental Disability Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on physical or mental impediments/challenges, whether such disabilities are congenital or acquired by heredity, accident, injury, advanced age, or illness.

Property Crimes – Burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, destruction/vandalism, false pretense/swindle, hacking/computer invasion, weapons law violation, extortion/blackmail, impersonation, drug equipment violations, drug/narcotic violations, and pornography/obscene material are reported as property crimes. (Weapons law violation, drug equipment violations, drug/narcotic violations, and pornography/obscene material are included in crimes against society in the FBI Hate Crimes Statistics Report.)

Racial Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons, such as Asians, Blacks, or whites, based on physical characteristics.

Religious Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being. Examples are Catholics, Jews, Protestants, or atheists

Sexual Orientation Bias – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on sexual preferences and/or attractions toward and responsiveness to members of their own or opposite sexes.

Simple Assault – An unlawful attack by one person upon another that does not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and in which there were no serious or aggravated injuries to the victim (FBI's UCR definition).

Single-Bias Event – A hate crime event motivated by a single type of bias.

Trial Verdict – The finding or answer of a jury or judge concerning a matter submitted to them for their judgment.

Uniform Crime Reporting – A federal reporting system that provides data on crime based on police statistics submitted by law enforcement agencies throughout the nation. The DOJ administers and forwards the data for California to the federal program.

Victim – An individual, a business or financial institution, a religious organization, a government entity, or other. For example, if a church or synagogue is vandalized or desecrated, the victim would be a religious organization.

Violent Crimes – Murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, kidnapping/abduction, simple assault, fondling, intimidation, sodomy, and sexual assault with an object are considered violent crimes in this report. (Robbery is included in crimes against property in the FBI Hate Crimes Statistics Report.)
